40 Days. For some that's a long time. For others, it's no time at all. I often wonder how Jesus felt about time, particularly when he wandered the wilderness for 40 days, avoiding temptations left and right. I wonder if Jesus felt his last week went by too slowly or was going by way too fast? I even wonder how Jesus prepared himself for what was to come?

Today we officially begin the season of Lent after Ash Wednesday. Every year, we recognize this season in the church leading up to Holy Week and Easter. Lent is a significant season for many reasons: it is a time we remember Jesus' struggles, sacrifices, and love that can be fully difficult to understand. It is also a time in which we remember our own struggles, our short-comings, and try to practice forgiveness (for ourselves and others). And it is also an intentional spiritual time in which we try to invite God's presence closer to our lives and find new practices that help us follow the Way of Jesus.

Every season of Lent, I always ask myself, "How can I become more intentional about inviting God into every part of my daily life?" Some years, I would let go of something that distracts me from God. In other years, I would take on a new practice that reminds me of God's constant presence. This year, I will be following along with my colleagues in Bethany Fellow who wrote in "Rest & Resilience: Following the Way of Jesus through Lent" as well as sharing a brief video each week that invites a new spiritual practice that you may choose to do during Lent.


These videos will be posted on our church Facebook page every Monday to begin your week.

Information, Please: Montgomery County's Helping Hands



Since the children began toting the baskets around the sanctuary last year, First Christian Church has given well over a ton of non-perishables to the FISH Food Pantry, which at times has struggled to keep the shelves stocked in the face of food

insecurity in Montgomery County. As the cans and jars are hauled to the pantry, church participants and their ecumenical partners take their turn unloading boxes when the Food Finders truck pulls up.

The church's generosity is also seen in the hats and gloves worn by the clients of Trinity Life Ministry, which are collected for the congregation-supported Scout troop. FCC hosts stuff-a-thons for the Volunteers for Mental Health in Montgomery County's holiday gift drive and has booked hotel rooms for people experiencing homelessness, among other outreach.

The agencies at the front lines of the county's most pressing needs will be spotlighted by the Good News/New Ministries committee in an upcoming Pathfinder series called **Information, Please: Montgomery County's Helping Hands**. The series draws largely from the local care providers directory Montcares.org.

Though not a comprehensive look at the area's active nonprofit sector, the series aims to promote local efforts to tackle issues ranging from food insecurity and housing to mental health and childcare access.

Montgomery County ranked 57th out of Indiana's 92 counties for charitable contributions as a percentage of income in 2022, according to a study from SmartAsset, a financial information and advice website. Residents donated 0.51% of their net income that year based on tax returns.

The series will also feature resources for free legal aid, the programs overseen by the Montgomery County Youth Service Bureau and the services of area public and college libraries.




