Despite the frustration, however, something keeps drawing me back to "finish" what I have started. Perhaps that's the greatest frustration; trying to decide when the painting is

This creative process has taken me much longer than I had imagined and has invited me to wrestle with the temptation to perfection, control, self-doubt, and even a stubborn will to produce a pre-decided outcome. With all of my willing for this painting to be one way, however; somehow it seems to have a life of its own to become another - its own creation made of "happy accidents."

What a metaphor for life and the journey of faith! With all of our good intentions, our desire to control or perfect our life, our self-doubt or certainty, somehow by God's grace, life has a mind of its own, moving to its own rhythm and offering us creative opportunities to "let go" and "let God" lead us into the mystery of the outcome. By so doing, we have the opportunity to surrender and lean on God who will graciously abide with us through the frustration, the grief, the joy, the control and the tumult.


When Jesus said, "It is finished" on the cross, I'm sure it was only natural for those who loved him to say, "this can't be! We had other ideas about the outcome - and this isn't what we pictured!". In time, however, amid their grief, frustration,

disappointment, and limited vision, God had other plans - an ending of death itself and a new beginning beyond anything they could ever ask for or imagine!

I suspect it will be much like this when I eventually finish my painting. All will not be over! Everything I have learned will be brought to a brand-new blank canvas with new hope and endless possibilities! In this season of Lent, perhaps God invites us to trust God's outcome, amid the storms of fear & disappointment. Whether it's an empty canvas or an empty tomb, God's gracious presence is much like a peaceful landscape upholding each step we take along the journey until the storm clears! Thanks be to God!



### Information, Please: Cold Weather



A handful of days in February may have felt more like April weather-wise, but then came the blanketing of snow and another blast of cold air.

In a county without emergency shelter for people experiencing homelessness, a local group of

recovering drug addicts has stepped up to bring in people from the cold.

When temperatures dip below 20 degrees, the Recovery Recreation Center, 1300 Ladoga Road, doubles as a cold weather warming station open to everyone. Staff offers food, a bag of supplies and a resource folder to those who come in. The station is open from 5 to 9 p.m. Monday-Friday and 6 to 9 p.m. Sunday.

As furnaces work overtime in colder weather, low-income families can receive help paying utility bills.

The Energy Assistance Program through the Community Action Program of Western Indiana makes a one-time payment to heating and electric companies for incomeligible families.

The program served more than 640 Montgomery County households in the 2021-22 season, obligating nearly \$690,000 according to the agency's latest annual report. Funding comes from a mix of local, state and federal grants.



This month's final checkup has me healing slow. Spring is around the corner and I went outside today to rake and toss leaves. I discovered daffodils already coming up!!


