During the Lenten Season we have been exploring some questions that Jesus posed to his listeners as a means to wonder about how those same questions might apply to our own life and faith. Strangely, however, of all the 307 questions Jesus asks in the bible, only one of them he asks of God. In his final


moments on the cross (as recorded in Matthew) Jesus utters the very last words of his life (from Psalm 22) by asking the question; "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" (Mt 27:46). Have you ever considered what it means that these were Jesus last words on earth in Matthew's Gospel? Where is the Good News here?

Frankly, they are some of the most hopeful words as we head towards Easter. In his worst hour, Jesus didn't ask anyone to save him, except for inviting God to consider, "If it is possible, let this cup pass from me, yet not what I want but what you want" (Mt 26:39). Yet in his final hour his faith does not turn to the crowd or to the Roman guards to ask to be saved, or to his mother, or brothers, or Disciples to air his frustration. He speaks directly to the one with whom he has the closest relationship - the one who he trusts with his deepest anguish, frustration, and the truth of his own fears - God has abandoned me. Have you ever felt this way in your deepest anguish? It's difficult to hear Jesus' question and not hear a response from God. Isn't that often the case when we first cry out to God in our deepest suffering. Sometimes it feels as if there is no answer.

In this case God didn't speak. Sometimes, anguish is the very thing that brings us to our knees and invites us to cut through the surface of our faith and go deeper...even if it means questioning God's intent. Perhaps that's the point of the cross...Grace can handle our pain, and rejoices when we have courage enough to speak the truth of our experience to God! Let us not forget...that after a few days, when the shock of it all began to settle in, God granted new life (beyond the grave)! Then God unleashed the Spirit of Christ, as promised, on day of Pentecost and

invited the church to embody the questions and honesty of Jesus that takes Grace seriously! Thanks be to God! Happy Easter!


Indiana Disciples Regional Assembly




