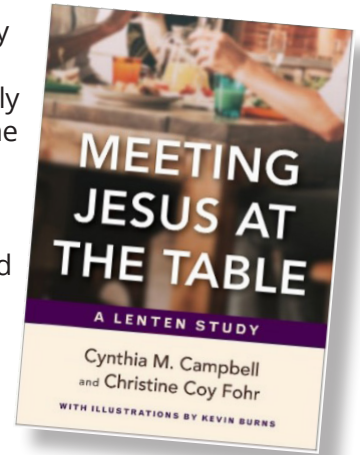
## Sugar and Spice and Everything Nice!

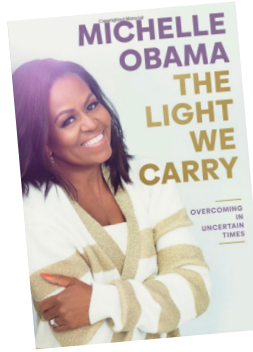

On Feb. 7th, we had another great discussion about **Learning to Walk in the Dark** by Barbara Brown Taylor.

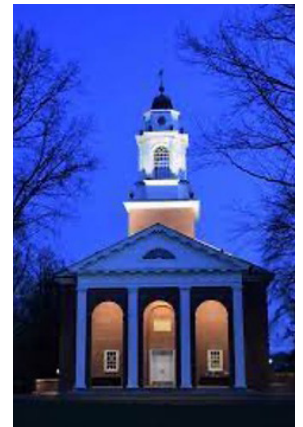

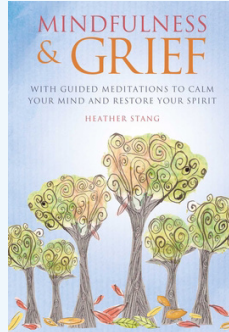

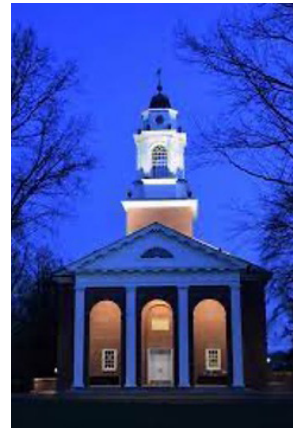


## Suicide Prevention Training March 8 from 12 - 2 pm at Christ Lutheran Church
