Last Sunday I began a Sermon Series entitled "Things That Matter" with the intention of introducing a series of self-reflective questions as a precursor for the upcoming Clergy and Congregational Renewal (CCR) time when I will be away on Clergy Renewal Leave (CRL) from April 17 - July 17. During the actual leave time, both the congregation and I will be taking intentional time apart to reflect on our own faith journeys, not only by considering some of the questions posed in this series, among others, but more importantly by exploring the "ROOTS & BRANCHES" of our life of faith, both personally and communally, the theme of the whole renewal experience.

The **1st month** of the renewal time, the congregation will have an opportunity to hear and read stories shared by the FCC community. These reflections will be looking back, with deep gratitude to God, as folks recall our early foundations, the **ROOTS** of our congregation that have sustained us and enabled us to flourish in faith through the years.

The **2nd month**, FCC folks will be sharing stories and reflections about experiences that convey something about our **CORE**, or



what sustains us and is enabling us to flourish in faith in the current time period. This will be a time of prayerfully taking our temperature, so to speak, and discerning, with God's guidance, the questions: "What are our greatest strengths?" and "Where are our growing edges?"

The **3rd month** members of our community will be sharing reflections and stories that give voice to their hopes and dreams for the **BRANCHES** in our future. This will be an important time

to prayerfully consider where God might be leading us in the journey ahead.

Throughout the three month CCR time, you will hear members' stories and reflections offered in worship, in multiple ways, shared in the newsletter, and when possible in smaller listening circles.

I will be engaging in some similar exercises and experiences of reflection while I am away on Clergy Renewal Leave. You will hear the details about my plans in the next installment of this newsletter series in our upcoming Pathfinder.

Camp Sunday Service Opportunity!



Organ Update

Our church organ developed some problems in December which were repaired on-site but then more problems occurred in January and the organ was unplayable. We did find a mouse nest in the organ but haven't determined if that was coincidental or the cause of the damage. Northside Music Company in Lafayette came and evaluated the organ and gave us a quote with several options.

The best news was that our organ is still a quality instrument and even though it's over 30 years old the manufacturer still supports it with a full line of repair parts. With this information, the best option is to have our organ repaired at a quoted cost of \$10,730, which fortunately we can cover using existing funds in the Trimble Memorial Fund. Northside Music will move the organ to their shop to make repairs then bring it back and set up and test on site as part of their quote. The repair is expected to take approximately 12 weeks and we have set up the electronic keyboard in place of the organ during this time.



Week of Compassion Auction

What a wonderful turnout of many generous donors for our Week of Compassion benefit auction!

Special thanks to all who helped organize and lead, all who donated items for auction, all the bidders, and all our youth who were tremendous helpers, bakers and leaders!! Last year we raised around \$6,200—but this year we've broken our record and are currently at around \$7,500, but donations are still coming in!

I Love to See Children Work

Wasn't it good to see that busy swarm of children on Sunday moving through the aisles collecting our food offerings for the Faith Food Pantry! I really




love those two or three minutes during worship when our kids gather in the groceries. We oldsters all seem to relish those moments.

I usually sit over on the right, by the aisle that is the last leg of their errand. When they reach that last aisle, their bags and baskets are getting heavy. Sometimes two little ones will each take a handle to share the load. Or one will muscle up on their basket or bag, determined to deliver their food for the hungry to the front of the sanctuary. Some mouths might be grimacing, but their eyes are laughing, and they certainly seem happy at their work.

Jesus said it: "I was hungry, and you gave me food." It's a simple project — non-perishable food for people in need. The bigger our weekly harvest, the more our children will work to gather it in. That's the kind of children's work I really like to see.

Note: Sunday's food offering put us over 500 lbs for 2023, and over 1,400 lbs since our weekly food ministry began in October 2022. Thank you all for your faithful support of Montgomery County's food-insecure population. ~Don Lindsay



Remember When...

We helped a congregation in Kinshasa, Africa, put a new roof on their church. At the time, we were starting a fund-raising campaign to join our two buildings. Becky Groves, chair of the World Outreach committee, felt we should do something for others while we were spending so much on something for ourselves. Others agreed and a plan was made to give 10% of whatever was raised to the church in Kinshasa for their roof. As a result, we sent them \$10,000.

To show their gratitude, the Kinshasa congregation sent us a bolt of cloth which we made into a communion cloth and altar cloths. These are often used on World Communion Sunday.

Remember When... We shared our building with a Hispanic congregation which had outgrown the house where they were meeting. During a discussion over coffee at the Scarlet Inn, Bernie Manker shared his concern with David Maharry about the plight of this group and planted the seed for them to share the use of our building.

After a few years, this thriving Hispanic congregation was able to purchase a church building on Garden Street and became Primera Iglesia Bautista.


