

One of the things I love about this community is its appreciation for the arts. Pastor Darla has been wanting to start having art shows again in the gallery/hallway by the Narthex, and I'm excited to announce we are starting on Sunday, March 20!

In the first of what we hope to be many shows, we will be featuring the paintings of Rob O'Dell—a well-known Indiana watercolorist who just happens to have been my dad. He painted mainly rural Midwest scenes—barns, trees, fences, flowers—although he also had phases in which he painted Southwest cliffs, Maine boats and rocks, and Irish fields and castles. Dad painted professionally for 50 years before he passed in 2017. The paintings we're showing are from the family's personal collections, a variety of subject matter painted at different points throughout his long career.

Dad was known for what I now know is called Magical Realism—it looks incredibly detailed and realistic, and yet the effect is created not by painstakingly rendering every single detail, but by different techniques, like salt crystals that bring out a lacy pattern in the weeds along a fenceline, or barn siding created by dragging a strip of matboard through the paint.

When I was growing up, even though I knew he was talented, I thought Dad's paintings were more of the "same ol' same ol." I mean, really, how many different barns or hollyhocks can there be?

As an adult, and now arguably the worlds' foremost expert on Rob O'Dell's art, I've realized that every one of Dad's paintings was unique. Even if he painted from the same photograph again and again, he changed the

trees, moved a fenceline, placed it on a hill, altered the seasons, or invoked a different mood in the sky.


Naturally, each of us will prefer some paintings over others, and we all like different styles and approaches.


But I think the best thing about Dad's work is that he found beauty everywhere he looked. He didn't try to make things perfect, but he looked at what was there—whether it was deserted and abandoned. or strong and still useful, whether it was nature that is objectively breathtaking or a mundane scene we might be tempted to overlook and he showed us the beauty inherent in it. Looking at Dad's paintings, I see the peace he found in doing what he loved, every day of his life, surrounded by the places he loved to paint.

I think we can all agree that we need more of that in the world. More joy, more beauty, more peace. And I believe we'll find it, if we'll just take a minute to notice that which is all around us.

I hope you'll find time to stop by and view the artwork between now and the end of April. And I look forward to talking more about creativity and faith on Sunday, March 20.

There are three groups, each meeting weekly for 60-90 minutes



The church has obtained a license from The Great Courses Teaching Company to use a unique DVD study series on Comparative Religion. The lectures are led by Dr. Charles Kimball, Presidential Professor and Chair of the Religious Studies Department, University of Oklahoma. Throughout this coming year we will study various topics from this series on a 3-4 week cycle.



Quoting from the course overview, "These lectures offer an opportunity to gain a grasp of the key ideas of religion itself—the issues that repeatedly surface when you look at any faith's beliefs, practices, and organization. Using five major religions—Judaism, Christianity, Islam, Buddhism, and Hinduism—as illustrations of how religions can address the same core issues in parallel and in significantly different ways. Comparative Religion compares and contrasts major religions and gives significance to religious

rights, rituals, and thought in religious traditions. This course looks at the common threads found in religious faiths worldwide and also how each faith is unique and powerful in its own tradition."

Starting Sunday, March 13, and continuing for four weeks, we will meet at 9 am on Sundays in the Parlor. The Wired Word class will pause during this time. Each session will begin with a 30-minute video followed by discussion. For those unable to attend in person, the lectures will also be shown again via Zoom (with discussion to follow) at 3:00 pm on the following Thursday.

Dr. Charles Kimball is Presidential Professor and Director of Religious Studies at the University of Oklahoma in Norman, Oklahoma. An ordained Baptist minister, he received his Th.D. from Harvard University in Comparative Religion with specialization in Islamic studies. He is a frequent lecturer in universities and church-related settings as well as an expert analyst on issues related to the Middle East, Islam, Jewish-Christian-Muslim relations, and the intersection of religion and politics. From 1983-1990 he was the Director of the Middle East Office at the National Council of Churches. He has lived in Egypt, frequently visits the Middle East, and has worked closely with Congress, the White House and the State Department during the past 25 years.

Communications Survey

Thanks to all who shared their opinions about the ways in which we communicate

with this community! We had about

50 responses, so thank you for taking time to help us! We have not made any decisions about any potential changes, but we value all of your thoughts and comments and will keep you posted! In the meantime, we wanted to share a few findings.

THANKS FOR YOUR

What you said:

- Most people read the newsletter by email, and everyone who responded said they skim it at a minimum but mostly read it all. To be fair, if they didn't read the newsletter, they wouldn't know about the survey :-).
- The newsletter is especially valuable to shut-ins as it helps them feel connected with the church and community.
- About 50% read it on their phone; 40% on a laptop, and 35% on a desktop. (That adds up to more than 100% because multiple answers were allowed.)
- 90% said the frequency of every two weeks is perfect.
- The most-read/valuable sections, in order, are: Info about worship, prayer list, front-page messages from pastors; ministry team updates, birthday and anniversaries, fellowship opportunities, calendar, youth updates, basic info about the church, and educational opportunities.
- Regarding content, a large majority felt the amount of info is just right, although 15% would like it to be shorter. 25% of readers think there is too much repetition.
- Many people would like to see more human interest stories included, and about half would like to have the calendar of events emailed weekly rather than included in the Pathfinder.
- About 2/3 of respondents are 65+ years of age. Each other age group had between 5 and 15% of respondents.

What you asked:

- Why don't we update prayer list more often? We ask people to tell us when the prayer needs change because we've hurt some people in the past by removing them from the list. If people want prayer for themselves or those they care about, we want them to have it.
- Why do you try to limit the length to 8 pages? And if you must do that, why not simply remove the graphics? The reason we strive for 8 pages is that we print and mail about 40 copies each week to people who cannot read it on a computer. Printer toner is expensive, and that length of newsletter can be mailed for 58 cents apiece. Any more pages will increase postage. We try to be good stewards financially and environmentally. Also, while graphics are not critical information, we think it makes it easier to read by breaking up large blocks of content, so we try not to lose that if we don't have to.
