PASTORAL MESSAGE
CAMP SUNDAY—APRIL 3RD

At the beginning of the month, Darla and myself traveled south to Camp Bedford in Bedford, Indiana. We attended the instillation service of the new Associate Regional Minister, Rev. Cheryl Russell. During the service, the keynote speaker shared how it seems a lot of ministers and lay leaders of the church received their faith callings by attending church camp. I know this is true for myself. I'm so thankful when I was a high school youth that my church took me to church camp, for it allowed me to connect with other youth at the time who were also exploring their faith in a safe, loving environment.

And I am so glad that camp continues to do the same thing for all our current youth and children! When I talked with two of our youth who went to camp last year, Justice Strietelmeier and Jacob Rangel, their eyes lite up with excitement and they immediately began to ask me when they can go back. Their excitement confirmed that God is still at work within our camps: fostering relationships with other youth exploring their faith and creating a safe environment for them to be themselves and grow closer to God.

I am excited to share that on April 3rd during our Sunday worship, we will have a chance to celebrate and promote our 2022 camp programs in the Indiana region:

Camp Bedford and Camp Geneva. These camps offer a variety of camps for all our children who are 5 to 18 years old. Camp Geneva even offers specialty camps such as You and Me camps for children and adults to attend together, as well as camps designed around the Arts and Sports!

In the last several weeks, several of our youth have requested about attending camp this summer. I would love to ask for the church's support in helping fund our camp scholarship budget so we may assist youth who are unable to afford church camp this summer. The overwhelming support of the church last year changed the lives of several of our youth who attended camp and if you are able to provide a donation to help our scholarship fund, I and our children would be most



Our annual Easter prayer vigil is coming up in a few weeks! Starting right after our Good Friday service on April 15th at 9am, people will have a chance to reflect upon Jesus' death and resurrection as well as take time out of our busy lives to pray and sit with God in the church sanctuary. The prayer vigil time is a meaningful experience for so many in the church. When asked, "Why do you participate in the prayer vigil?" church members Rex Henthorn and Kelly Stanley responded:

"Why do I always attend the Easter prayer vigil? To be alone with God. Although one can be alone with God at all conscious times if they try and are able to ignore the noises, distractions, and time limitations of life, but it is particularly meaningful to sit in the sanctuary alone .. in God's house. It is difficult to describe the renewed awe of humanity's blessing arising from events over 2000 years ago as I engage myself in a contemplation of my personal relationship with God in silence, uninterrupted, void of distraction, and alone."—Rex Henthorn

"There's something powerful about being alone with God in this holy space. Last year, as I flipped through the written prayers left from previous participants, I was moved by each person's words. In this church, we talk a lot about community, and being part of the universal Church—but it's beautiful to realize that it is each individual's faith that inspires their collective actions. And it's humbling to be given the chance to add one more voice to the chorus of prayers going up during those days."—Kelly Stanley

Coming in May:

PRAYER REBOOT with Kelly Stanley

Does your prayer life ever feel stale? Do you get bored? Tired? Frustrated? Do you have doubts about whether this prayer thing is really all it's cracked up to be? When we get together and talk about our individual experiences with prayer, we can all learn from one another, and along the way, we might find a new type of energy or inspiration for our prayer lives.

Praying for each other is a way to build relationships and foster deeper connection. It's the most loving thing you can do for your neighbor—and when we commit to praying for someone, it changes the way we care for them. This group will help build and strengthen those connections with each other.

The Prayer Reboot will be a cross between a class and a prayer group. It will be an exploration and an interactive discussion, with me facilitating but not necessarily "teaching." I will encourage the group to talk about prayer—what it is, what our experiences have been and how it has sustained or failed us, different ways to practice, how our views on it have changed, whether we believe in an active God, and so on. We'll explore together and learn from each other.

The topics would not be formal, liturgical approaches to prayer (like breath prayers or meditation), but an expansion of what people may or may not do or experience as prayer in their everyday life. The lessons will be designed to take us out of our comfort zones (in a loving, gentle, unforced way!) and expand our concept of what prayer can look like.

Each session will begin with a brief discussion on a specific topic, followed by a brief time of prayer requests, followed by prayer. There will be a small homework assignment each time—something more experiential than intellectual (for instance, exploring different postures of prayer—how does it feel to stand vs kneel vs holding hands up, etc.), which will be discussed the following week.

Details:

- 4 weekly one-hour sessions during the month of May
- Time/day will depend on the interest. Options: Monday afternoons from 3-4 or Sundays at 11:30 (brown bag lunch session—assuming we are able to share food together by then)




LEADERSHIP RETREAT






Children's Church
