In the last three editions of the Pathfinder, I shared what the congregation would be doing and experiencing while

I'm away during our Clergy and Congregational Renewal (CCR) time from April 17 - July 17. I also reflected on the CCR's overall theme of **Roots and Branches**, which is grounded in John 15:5, and how I would be engaging in the **ROOTS** and **CORE** portion of my time away. In this edition I want to share with you how I'll be engaging in the **BRANCHES** portion (or cultivating vision and dreams for the future) of my Clergy Renewal time. I liken this time of visioning as a way of living into the footsteps of Jesus who took precious time to go off by himself and pray, including his 40 days in the wilderness, to listen for God's leading in the face his own struggles, hopes, fears and vision for his ministry ahead.

This may perhaps be the most important part of the CCR time for both my time away and the congregation's time together. During the whole 3 months I will be carefully tending to create time and space to listen to the Holy Spirit's whispering in my heart through intentional reflection and prayer time, worship with other congregations and spiritual reading, taking time for stillness and journaling, most of all creatively dreaming and visioning about where I see my gifts best being shared as your pastor in the years ahead! I will be praying to be courageously open to the creative possibilities the Spirit might present, that could change my ministry and yours, in ways that will further build our life and

witness together in powerful ways. I am inviting each of you to do the same and to share your insights with each other, in the story circles, Sunday morning conversations and simply one on one with each other. Your support of his exploration and leadership will be essential to his growth, as well as yours, and mine.

With all this said, I most want to leave you with my heart, that will miss seeing you on a daily basis, being able to grab a cup of coffee or a meal with you, to share in meetings and moments where we connect about the deeper things in our own lives and the life of the church, and I will miss hearing regularly from you by e-mail and text and phone. It will be a strange time but an important time for the you and I to re-imagine what God has in store for all of us together when we come back together in July. As part of our congregational renewal time, First Christian Church is holding three "Story Circles" over the next three months. **These small group discussions about our lives and faith are an important part of the overall theme and planning for this renewal time.** We think they'll also be fun! When we gather together, there is always laughter and connection and kindness.

How will this work? Each gathering will start at 4 pm in Fellowship Hall, where the topics for the afternoon will be introduced. Everyone will get copies of the questions we'll discuss. No advanced prep is required, because these are questions about your life. Then we'll divide into small groups, or "story circles." The groups will gather in different areas (parlor, chapel, library, etc.) to discuss the prompts and share a bit about ourselves in the process. We'll wrap up at 5:30.

Why should I come? These times of intentional sharing in safe spaces will help us build our relationships with each other, strengthen our bonds within this church, and provide an opportunity to reflect on our individual spiritual lives.

Who's invited? Everyone who is or wants to be part of our church community is welcome. **Childcare** is available, but please be sure to indicate that child care is needed when you sign up.

Which Story Circle should I come to? All of them, if possible! Each gathering will be different so please come to as many as you can!

How do I sign up? Signup sheets are on an easel in the narthex, near the stairs to the sanctuary. You may also email fcc.comm211@gmail.com or call the church office (765-362-4812) to tell us which sessions you can attend. *Pre-registration is not required* but is helpful to us in planning.

Curious about the Congregational and Clergy Renewal Committee?

In the Spring of 2022, the Sabbatical Committee WHO? was recruited by members of our church leadership. Members of this committee are Nick Hedrick, Tom Keedy. Kate Lindsay, Dave Maharry, Amber Rohr, Kelly Stanley, **Linda Weaver, and Pastors** Kevin Toth and Darla Goodrich.

As with all committees one of the first orders of business was to identify roles and I, Kate, offered to be its WHERE? chair as the new kid on the block and seeing that others were already wearing multiple hats. The committee meets monthly. Because our focus was both on what the congregation would be doing as well as Pastor Darla, we changed the name to the Congregational and Clergy Renewal

Committee.

Darla told us of her conceptualization of "roots and branches" for her renewal time, divided into three parts: roots (past), core/trunk (present), and branches (future). We began trying to identify how to guide our community through its own 3 months of renewal. Our past and future plans include:

The archive committee—led by Judy Michal, with Barbara Frye, Nick Hedrick, Pat Hooper, and Carolyn Snyder, has been looking into our "roots" in preparation for our 200th Anniversary in 2026.

"Telling Our Story" workshops, led by the talented Gwynn Wills, guided many of you in sharing your own faith journeys or experiences of church community.

- Scriptural guides and prompts for people to share their stories during worship, shaped by our Pastor Kevin, Pastor Darla, and Kelly Stanley.
- **Story Circles**, three gatherings in which we can share our stories and connect with others. (See details on page 2 of this newsletter.)
- A special historical program planned by Judy Michal and others for May 7 that you won't want to miss.
- A potluck lunch following our annual congregational meeting on June 25th.
- **Musical offerings** supporting the themes of renewal under the leadership of Jerry Whipkey.
- **Selected written stories** to be shared through the Pathfinder.

Bits-o-history

After studying three different historical accounts, Nick Hedrick shares his interpretation of the story of the tombstone found under our church.

Foster Fields is dead. The ol'sheriff got his skull cracked over a stupid fence. John Bloomfield did it, but he's not a murderer. The charge doesn't stick without witnesses.

Some people believe the quarreling neighbors were going at it that day in 1829 over a lane separating their farms down there by Alamo. Some people think Bloomfield swung a club, someone else wrote it was a stake. Nobody was there to referee.

Bloomfield had his day in court and walked out a free man. By then, Fields was six feet under, but where? With the Revolutionary patriots at Old Town Cemetery? In the woods by the college? Maybe it was under the old First Christian Church because in the late 1880s or '90s that's where the wrecking crew found his tombstone, smashed into a half-dozen chunks of slate. R.K. Krout came up from Ripley Township to take a look and decided it must have been the handiwork of John Speed, the abolitionist stone mason politician. Evidently, the tombstone was handy when the time came to shore up the building's foundation.
