Ending Hunger: What's God Got to Do with it?



Former General Minister and President of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), Dick Hamm, will be giving a presentation on Ending Hunger in our own communities and has invited us to join him for this event. Dick Hamm now serves as lead denomination ambassador for Bread-Indiana. He and his family were also members of FCC during his early childhood years!

This workshop is designed to help lay leaders and clergy alike consider the call on faithful Christians to speak up for those who face food insecurity. As you know, churches often address hunger through food pantries and the like. But research shows only 15% of the need around us is met by all the charitable sources combined. Most folks don't want to be 15% Christians. So, they are working hard to understand the root causes of hunger — how to change the systems that cause hunger in the first place. This workshop begins to name what our faith has to do with our advocacy: How and why we are called to get involved through more than simply charity. It's a great way to introduce your congregation to this kind of public witness.

GREAT COURSE ADDED

The church library has added another Great Course, The Triumph of Christianity, to our collection. Lectures given by Bart Ehrman cover the history and growth of Christianity from its beginnings of 20 followers to the millions it has today. It calls upon the writings of ancient historians to tell the story of conflicts between the pagan and Christian followers, how a war led to the influence of Rome from the time of Constantine, the politics, the Jews, etc. There is much to learn about the triumph of Christianity.
