
PASTORAL MESSAGE

Hello Everyone!

I pray you are well at the time you are reading this Pathfinder. In each Pathfinder edition, we will be

featuring a new story and share the many ways in which our faith has grown and how First Christian Church has impacted us.

I remember the first time I heard of the name FCC Crawfordsville. I was completing my second year of Hospital Chaplain residency in Mansfield, Texas. At the time, I was searching for my next ministry opportunity and was open to working at another hospital or at a church. The previous year, I had put my name in search and call and was unsuccessful in finding a new church home. That changed when I received an email from a Mr. David Maharry. He had received my ministerial portfolio and requested an interview. Several weeks passed before I was virtually face to face with several of the members on the search team: Sara Nicodemus, Ray Cedars, Barb Foster, Daniel Petrie, Carrie Siddens, Linda Spencer, Dave Maharry, and Darla Goodrich. It was a pleasant interview and before I knew it. I was asked for another interview. After the 2nd interview, Dave asked me to journey to Crawfordsville, Indiana.



I arrived on March 13th and was given a tour of the town, of the church, and had a wonderful fellowship dinner with the entire team at Darla's home. I was thankful for the hospitality of everyone and also for the chance to see and experience a part of Crawfordsville before everything shut down just a day later on March 15th.

Ever since this church called me as your associate minister almost three years ago, I have been blessed. A minister from my Bethany Fellows group once asked me why I said yes to coming here. My answer was simple: This church reminds me of my home church in North Carolina. Like my home church, everyone truly cares about one another

and is dedicated to serving our neighbors. Like my home church, we are a diverse group of people and yet we are still dedicated to being a community with each other. And like my home church, we support the ministries of our youth and children. Being called to First Christian Church feels like I am being called home again and for that I am thankful for you all!

This is one of many ways in which First Christian Church has impacted my faith journey thus far. I look forward to hearing your stories of your time in the church as we continue to become renewed and connected with one another through our storytelling!

As part of our congregational renewal time, First Christian Church is holding three "Story Circles" over the next three months. **These small group discussions about our lives and faith are an important part of the overall theme and planning for this renewal time.** We think they'll also be fun! When we gather together, there is always laughter and connection and kindness.

How will this work? Each gathering will start at 4 pm in Fellowship Hall, where the topics for the afternoon will be introduced. Everyone will get copies of the questions we'll discuss. No advanced prep is required, because these are questions about your life. Then we'll divide into small groups, or "story circles." The groups will gather in different areas (parlor, chapel, library, etc.) to discuss the prompts and share a bit about ourselves in the process. We'll wrap up at 5:30.

Why should I come? These times of intentional sharing in safe spaces will help us build our relationships with each other, strengthen our bonds within this church, and provide an opportunity to reflect on our individual spiritual lives.

Who's invited? Everyone who is or wants to be part of our church community is welcome. **Childcare** is available, but please be sure to indicate that child care is needed when you sign up.

Which Story Circle should I come to? All of them, if possible! Each gathering will be different so please come to as many as you can!

How do I sign up? Signup sheets are on an easel in the narthex, near the stairs to the sanctuary. You may also email fcc.comm211@gmail.com or call the church office (765-362-4812) to tell us which sessions you can attend. *Pre-registration is not required* but is helpful to us in planning.


Coming up next:

Bit-o-history

In 1960, when the church's pipe organ was about to be replaced with an electronic organ, Ken Buser wrote "The Old Pipe Organ." In this poem, he shares his memories of the organ when he first came to the church as a boy of six and his regret many years later to see it as "a pile of debris." Here are some of the verses:

When Sunday School was over, into the church we marched. And I got all squirmy, like my undershirt was starched. Then all at once I saw it, with the greatness of its size And huge pipes all gleaming gold, as if reaching for heaven's skies.

I stared at it in wonder, then it began to play; Softly at first, then swelling, 'til it thundered like a stormy day. To a small boy, it seemed so splendid, this great organ in the loft. Yet such a giant wonder, could play so sweetly soft.

Even when it stopped playing, I could hardly move my stare, While a man down front was talking, what he said I didn't care. As we left, I still remembered how the low notes would feel, Pounding in my chest, during the organ's peal.

After sharing his memories of the pipe organ through the years, he concludes with these verses:

Now I know it's not an organ that I mourn so tenderly, It's my own selfishness, to bring back a memory. So when the new organ plays, the sweet music will mean to me That a good life isn't built without first rising from its own debris.

The electronic organ was replaced with our current organ which was purchased from a bequest from Francis Scott who was the organist at First Christian for 46 years.
