A message from Rev. Dr. Howard Goodrich, our former Indiana Regional Minister and a Global Ministries Mission Co-Worker, with Rev. Darlene Goodrich, throughout southern Africa.



Nearly 200 years ago, in 1826, Elder Michael Combs, a strong devotee of the Christian Church frontier movement, arrived in Crawfordsville

with his family after he'd been preaching for several years in the East and the South. After clearing dense wild forests of abundant oak, poplar, walnut, sugar maple, and sycamore, where it was said you could hardly see the sunlight, Combs built a small humble 40' x 60' log cabin and established First Christian Church Crawfordsville (FCCC). Soon thereafter, new settlers arrived at a growing pace enabling the church to grow.

It was only just five years earlier, in 1821, that Crawfordsville, previously an unexplored frontier, had just begun. It was the pristine homeland of several Indigenous communities, including the Piankeshaws, the Miamis, the Potawatomis, and the Shawnees. Just a little less than 2 decades before Crawfordsville's founding, between 1804 and 1806, the Lewis and Clark Expedition traveled up the Missouri River and made it to the west coast and back, Spanish trading took place along the

Mississippi River and The Louisiana Purchase was made in 1803.

It was during these groundbreaking years in the country's history, and during the second great awakening of the early 19th century, that Barton W. Stone, an American evangelist and outstanding Christian Church leader led the largest of all Western revivals at Cane Ridge, Kentucky in 1801. The almost weeklong Cane Ridge Revival was attended by an estimated 20,000 to 40,000 Christians of every denomination and background where they celebrated their Christian unity by worshiping and sharing communion together. This was unprecedented!

Later in 1833, six years after FCCC was established, Stone's "Christian" movement, also referred to as the "Stoneites" or the "New Lights" merged with the "Disciples" movement, led by Alexander Campbell. Campbell's movement, known as the Restoration movement of primitive Christianity, relied on the scriptures alone as a means for unity. Once the movements came together, they were known as the Christian Churches or Churches of Christ.

The movement took off like wildfire on the frontier with emphasis on returning to the simple faith of the New Testament church through the centrality of Jesus himself with the scriptures

alone as the guide. Hence, human creeds, dogma or barriers to the Christian life were removed with the intent of welcoming all to the faith with the Lord's table as central to the expression of God's welcoming grace in Jesus Christ. Since then, the Christian Church initiated, and has always been a leader in, the global ecumenical (oikoumenē - to dwell together) movement to bring churches together in order that we might witness to the gift of Christ's reconciliation and love as central to our very existence and reason for being.

FCCC is part of this great global movement and story, and shares in its deepest roots! Did you know that even both our founders visited and preached at FCCC? Barton Stone while visiting churches in Indiana, Kentucky, and Ohio in 1843, visited and preached at First Christian Church. This was just one year before his death. Alexander Campbell preached at FCC on January 1, 1861, just four months before the beginning of the civil war. Since then, we have weathered the great changes of time, shifts in circumstances, and thrived by the grace of God in Christ through the great cloud of witnesses who have broken bread around the Lord's Table of unity through nearly the past 200 years at FCCC. Thanks be to God!





Rediscovering the Parables of Jesus

In this time of the Clergy and Congregational Renewal, as we take time to tell our stories and the stories of this community of our church, I found myself thinking about the stories that Jesus told that we find in his parables. I have pulled them together in what I think of as somewhat common themes so we can consider them over a period of four weeks, **beginning May 28**. **See you each Sunday at 9 am (instead of the Wired Word) as we rediscover the Parables of Jesus.**

To study parables, we should:

- 1) Read the parable, and then read it again.
- 2) Try to discover the original situation. To whom was Jesus telling the story, his disciples, the Pharisees, or? This may require reading the text around the parable, what comes before, etc.
- 3) Try to discover the description of our ordinary human lives to which Jesus is speaking today. Try to think of how Jesus might tell the parable to us, or to an equivalent group of people in today's world. What change is Jesus calling for from his audience?

Are there other parables that we have not listed here which you would like to consider? Bring them with you and let's explore them together. Especially bring parables that seem most powerful to you, or are most difficult to understand.

They recall at one such dinner, the 4-year-old was helping to pass out cookies she had helped bake to everyone with a huge smile on her face. David and his wife said the family sees them as the "grandparents of their American family" and they are so fortunate to have gotten to know such a wonderful family.

Another way the team worked to connect the family to the community was by taking them to

different things around Indianapolis. They helped the family get a pass to the Children's Museum (which they love to go to frequently), organized a trip to the zoo, the State Fair, gone for picnics in the local park and more. The team wanted the family to not just know but enjoy their new home and community.

While their official time as a Community Support Team at Exodus has ended, many team members are still close with the family and have continued to support them. The team learned a lot about the challenges refugees face and has continued to learn about other immigrants in their community and started outreach to them as well.
