PASTORAL MESSAGE **MENTAL HEALTH MATTERS**

At the beginning of the month, I traveled to my first (in-person) Bethany Fellows retreat located at Mundelein Seminary in Chicago, IL. While I have been a part of Bethany Fellows since September 2020, I have not had the pleasure of being in the same physical space of other ministers in this program due to the pandemic. For anyone who may not be aware, Bethany Fellows is a ministry program designed to mentor and support young clergy as they enter their first four years of congregational service. Bethany Fellows indirectly serves congregations by assisting pastors within the program and offers two retreats a year, as well as year-round counsel and support. Each retreat is filled with fellowship time with other ministers across the country as well as educational and spiritual workshops and even time in silence to renew our spirits and energy.

While the purpose of each retreat is for us to walk away feeling more refreshed and energized than when we began the retreat, another purpose of the retreats includes being educated and empowered in our ministry setting. During this past retreat, we engaged in dialogue regarding Mental Health. I thought this was very relevant for many reasons. For one, May just happens to be Mental Health awareness month. But also, mental health is often not talked about enough in our society and lives and our presenters, Rev. Sarah Griffth

BE KAND TO YOUR MIND

Lund and Rev. Julian DeShazier, spoke with us about the stigma around mental health and how we as Pastors can break the stigma in

our congregations. Rev. Lund just happens to be the senior pastor of First Congregational UCC in Indianapolis and recently wrote a book called,

"Blessed Youth" which goes into detail in how we can care for our wonderful youth who are struggling with their mental health. I received a free copy of her book and thus far, I have gained a lot of insight into this very important topic.

I believe our mental health is just as important as our physical and spiritual health. It's one of the reasons I personally see a therapist because my mental health is invaluable to me. The

same reason I see my doctor for my physical health and a spiritual director for my spiritual health; my holistic health is important to me. And I hope your holistic health is

important to you as well. It can be easy to be caught in the shame when trying to take care of our mental health. I'm here to say that it is alright to take care of your mental health, because you matter, just as much as your physical and spiritual health

matters.

I will continue to talk more on this important topic the next time I preach on May 29th. But if you like to share your thoughts or be dialogue with me about mental health or my involvement in Bethany Fellows, I am more than happy to speak with you.

Modified from David Hadley's email with names omitted to keep the family's relatives safe from the Taliban:

Representatives from 7 Crawfordsville churches (the Crawfordsville ARC – Afghan Resettlement Coalition) gathered on Saturday May 7 with our family for a fun picnic in Milligan Park. The Afghan family, which resides in Brownsburg, thoroughly enjoyed the picnic and meeting for the first time their Crawfordsville friends. B_____ (the husband) told us that they consider us their family in America. B____ (the wife) got in the pitch-in picnic mode by bringing four delicious Afghan dishes. S____ (the daughter) made new friends quickly with the children who came to welcome her. It was a very special event for the family and for all of us.

B_____ (the husband) is working five days a week at a distribution facility in Plainfield and really appreciated a day off from the physical work that he does. We are still working to solve the transportation issue. Uber is much too expensive for his daily commute, but that has been the stopgap solution. We have access to a motor scooter and will see if that can be a good weather option. He remains concerned about getting legal help to get permanent residency and has been contacted by an attorney from Exodus Refugee Immigration (the Indianapolis agency with which the family and we are working).

B____ (the wife) and S___ seem to be doing well. B___ and B___ are interested in enrolling four-year-old S___ in preschool. We will help them contact the Brownsburg schools to explore the possibilities. After watching S___ today, we are certain she will thrive in preschool.

Again, thank you all for supporting the family. Please continue to keep them in your prayers.

SERVICE OPPORTUNITIES IN OHIO & KY!

DAYTON, OHIO - Tornado Recovery

In response to the May 2019 tornado outbreak, **Week of Compassion** is supporting an innovative collaboration called the Tornado Survivors' Pathways to Homeownership, which helps families displaced from tornado-damaged rental housing become first-time homeowners.

In partnership with the Christian Church in Ohio, the Heartland Conference United Church of Christ, and the United Church of Christ Disaster Ministries, we are hosting **volunteer teams of 4-10 people through July 2022** to finish interiors of new/rehabbed homes and address an affordable housing shortage. Volunteers must be 14 years of age or older (mixed age groups must have 1 adult for every 4 volunteers under 18).

Housing is provided, if desired, (\$50/person/week) at United Christian Church, where teams will have access to a kitchen to prepare meals. Showers will be at the YMCA across the street. Preferred work schedule is Monday-Friday, but other schedules can be accommodated as availability allows.

MADISONVILLE, KENTUCKY - Tornado Recovery

An historic tornado outbreak on Dec. 10, 2021 cause severe damage in multiple communities. We are partnering with FCC Madisonville and Fuller Center Disaster Rebuilders to receive volunteers during spring/summer 2022.
