A REFLECTION FROM GERRY AND DONNA COATS



Our story at First Christian Church began soon after we were married in 1964 and began our life together in Crawfordsville. As we settled in and started looking for a new church, our intent was to visit several different churches. Both having grown up in small Christian churches, we began with First Christian.

We were immediately welcomed, introduced, included, and nurtured. The beautiful sanctuary, wonderful music, and strong preaching and teaching seemed to both awe and surround us. After almost 59 years we are still at times in awe in this special place, which has taught us so much, strengthened us in so many ways, and still holds and moves us as wel have become elder members rather than newlyweds.

In 1967 we welcomed our daughter, Dana, and in 1970 our son, Brad. This truly was their church home, where they too were nurtured and included, taught, and challenged. In October 1989 our daughter was married in this church where she had grown up.

We were so very fortunate to have the Rev. Olive Hoke as our Minister of Christian Education. She guided, directed, and led many inclusive programs for families and children. One of these was the "Hanging of the Greens." On the first Sunday evening in December everyone dressed in their best and came together to decorate the church for the Advent Season, a



lovely way for families to begin the season.

Also during this time, Rex Henthorn led a young couples' discussion Sunday School class. This was often a large grop and a way for many of us to really get to know each other as we and our families grew together. We enjoyed family activities, picnics at the Shades, and pitch-in dinners. Eventually, a large group of us spent a weekend traveling to Cane Ridge to explore our church's birthplace and held our own service there. Many of us, along with some new members, made this trip again in July 2019.

We hope and are sure that many of our young families and new members are finding these same kinds of fellowship and learning opportunities here today.

We also remember so many older members who paved the way for us, Frieda Cosby, Margaret Miller, Russell Heath, and so many others who worked in leadership roles, but also in the background. Edlie Ball inspired us to establish a free nursery school, which existed for over 45 years. This was a huge undertaking and a valuable community outreach.

I have only scratched the surface of our time here: multi church Vacation Bible School at Camp Rotary, Christian Women's Fellowship, Christian Youth Fellowship, Bible studies, board Retreats, many Sunday School classes and groups, committees, accepting leadership roles, carry-in dinners, summer lunches, funeral dinners, and learning, learning, learning.

What began with a visit from Cliff Everett, Dennis Brown, and Clyde Gentry climbing up the stairs to our first apartment to be sure that we felt welcomed to First Christian Church has becme a cherished home to our family. How richly we have been blessed!



# The FCC Meals on Wheels Program

The Meals on Wheels program, or MOW, has been an important part of the Montgomery County community for many, many years. And First Christian Church has been an integral part of it for essentially all of that time. Each week day MOW drivers deliver about 40 meals to people, mainly elderly, around the community. These are divided into five routes with about 8 deliveries on each route. FCC members deliver the meals on each Friday in the even months, thus we will be deliver-ing the 5 Fridays in June and the 4 Fridays in August.

You would ride shotgun, or be the sidekick, or vice-deliverer, or whatever title you would want to give yourself; the pay is the same whatever the title. Delivering the meals requires that the meals be picked up at the hospital kitchen at about 10:30am and the deliveries take about 1:15 so your job is complete by about 11:45 or so. The recipients of the meals really appreciate the good food and the daily contact with someone as most of these folks live alone. Let me know if you are interested or want to learn more about the program.

### "Home"

In 1923, the church board purchased the house at 211 S. Walnut to be a parsonage, a home for the minister of the church.

When Rev. Miller moved to Crawfordsville in 1963 to be the minister, he and his wife wanted to purchase their own home rather than use the parsonage. The house then became the home for Sunday School rooms, a church office, and a pastor's study.

Recently, when one of our current church members was asked to reflect on "The first time I knew this church was 'home' was ....", he responded, "When I walked into the former parsonage for Sunday School class, I felt like I was home."

That house was torn down in 1969 to make room for the Education Building to be built on that spot. The new building became a home of a different s ort when the women of the church started a nursery school there. One day one of the children who attended was so excited when she told her mother, "Mommy, there is a church in my preschool!"

May God help us to continue making our church a "home" to those who come here.
