PASTORAL MESSAGE

When I was called to be your Senior Minister (beginning in August of 2016), FCC leadership and I agreed that, after

serving 5 years in this role, it would be mutually beneficial for me and for the congregation to observe a 3-month time of sabbatical renewal. In August of 2021, I became eligible to observe this 3-month sabbatical time but did not feel it was a good time for us to be away from each other due to the effects of COVID-19 that kept us from gathering.

For this reason, in conjunction with the FCC Board's approval and in consultation with my Pastoral Relations Committee (PRC), we have mutually agreed that I will observe 3 months of sabbatical time next year from Monday, April 17 - Monday, July 17, 2023. During this time both the congregation and I will engage in activities that are designed to deepen our spiritual connection with God, ourselves, one another, and the world we love and serve. The theme of the Sabbatical, collaboratively selected by myself, Pastor Kevin and my PRC, will be "Roots and Branches."

As we draw closer to our 200th anniversary as a congregation in

2026, 2023 will be an opportune time to begin to deeply reflect on how the foundation of Christ himself and the many forebearers of FCC (our "roots") have paved a solid foundation for our future together. Congregational members will have the opportunity to share stories of their life and faith with each other in small groups while I am away. Members will also be sharing their reflections from the pulpit. At the same time, I will be reading and traveling, praying, and reflecting on my own spiritual journey and the amazing path we have been able to walk together—even as you and I both will be considering what the future holds for our life ahead together (our "branches").

Plans for both the congregation and I are currently being

considered and will be described in forthcoming articles. I will also share the "Roots and Branches" vision for the Sabbatical at the FCC Congregational Meeting on June 26, 2022. The current vision has Pastor Kevin stepping up to fill in while I am away, along with an FCC Sabbatical Committee and other FCC spiritual leaders in our midst to create a wonderful experience of spiritual growth for the whole congregation. More details will continue to follow as plans begin to come together for this special moment in our life together. In the meantime, if you have any questions or concerns, please reach out to me, my PRC, or our FCC Board.

Bethel AME Church 175th Anniversary Celebration

The opening celebration of the 175th anniversary celebration of Bethel AME Church will be on **Sunday afternoon, June 12th at 3:30 p.m.** Presiding Bishop John Franklin White of the 4th District of the AME Church will be the special quest and speaker.

The congregation obtained the property on North Street in 1847 and built a log church building. The current sanctuary where the service will be held was built in 1892. Volunteers from First Christian undertook the project to repair and preserve the building. The first school for African American students was built on the property and named the Lincoln School after the Civil War.

Bethel AME will continue with anniversary services of celebration through June and July.
