REFLECTIONS ON PRAYER FROM YOUR EDUCATION CHAIR

Prayer... it's such a hard thing, isn't it? Except when it isn't. When things are bad, prayer is usually one of my first instincts. (Wish I could say that was *always* true, but it's not.) But when things are good, or even ordinary, I occasionally struggle with what to say. That's part of the reason I love to create the prayer prompt calendars—because I think sometimes we could all use a little help.

Recently, I got to teach a four-week "Prayer Reboot" class here at FCC. One of the main questions we discussed was this: How do I know when God answers me? What if I've been praying forEVER for a certain thing and I just never hear from God? I don't hear a voice, I don't see "coincidences," and I just don't know if the lack of answer means "no" or if God just hasn't answered yet.

I wish I had good answers for that. I think it's one of the most frustrating aspects of prayer relying on our own judgment and observations and having to trust ourselves when we believe we've received an answer.

Not long ago, I read Sue Monk Kidd's *The Book of Longings*. I often enjoy biblical fiction, because through it so many stories from the Bible have come to life for me, but I was reluctant to read this one at first because I'm wary of someone trying to portray Jesus (especially Jesus as someone's husband).

THE PATHFIND

I ended up loving the book. While the author doesn't profess divine insights or even a religious background or reason for writing it, the way she portrayed Jesus brought me to tears and to my knees.

The character of Jesus was leading a resistance, in effect, and trying to decide what to do and where to go and all of that. People tried to lift him up on a pedestal and he wasn't having it. But in order to figure out what he needed to do next, he went off to pray, and then he struggled—as each of us does—with whether or not to trust his instincts, to listen to that inner voice.

Before he began his public ministry, the *character* of Jesus (as portrayed in the book and contrary to some teachings I've heard), wondered whether he could truly make the leap to profess God as his father to others. Could he be bold enough to proclaim what he believed to be true, what he felt God telling him, and move forward in faith with the ministry he felt called to?

And I thought, whoa. I'd never considered the possibility that Jesus might have had questions or doubts, too. Of course, it's quite possible that he did not. Perhaps he always knew exactly who he was and what he was meant to do.

But what if he *did* have those moments of wondering before he fully embraced his role? Scripture shows us clearly that he DID acknowlegde and profess it, but it seems to me it's possible that he had to wrestle with God to get to that point. If so, then one more way we can learn from Jesus is knowing that he let the voice of faith—God the Father's voice—speak more loudly than his doubts.

Maybe this idea gives us another hint into the ways that Jesus was like us. Is that what it meant for him to be both fully human and fully divine—wrestling with his human side? Learning to lean on the voice of God, which isn't always booming and loud and audible? If so, if there is any part of this idea that might be accurate, how beautiful and encouraging for **us**.

When we wrestle, when we seek wisdom and answers, when we learn to take those baby steps towards trusting God, maybe it is in those moments when we are most like Jesus. Perhaps we don't need big, obvious signs after all. Perhaps we have already been equipped with the faith we need to get through the good and the bad and in the in-between.

Thanks be to God, the author and finisher of our faith, and the bringer of hope.

Need Covid tests?


