Disciples don't bring as many covered dishes to church as the Methodists of my childhood, but one day in the Before Times there was a pitch-in after worship and the conversation at my table turned to music.

First Christian's incredible music director at the time. Richard Bowen, name-dropped Buffy Sainte-Marie. "Is she a drag queen?" I joked.

While the decades-long discography of the First Nations singer and activist had never found its way onto my playlist, I was discovering a welcoming and intellectually stimulating community at the "Church with the Windows" just after my thirtieth birthday in 2019.

The best part about turning thirty was no longer being in my twenties. Life was marinated with the grief of leaving behind the university campus where I had introduced myself to me. I

languished in a career that brought little joy.

As the milestone year arrived, I was on a mission to start living a less miserable life. A longing for human connection (without the deadline pressure) nudged me to give church a second chance.

Believers might say God led me to First Christian. I don't subscribe to the concept of a divine being; as I wrote in one of Gwynn Wills' storytelling workshops, God belongs to everybody else. But the influence of a holy spirit in a person's life is not trivial. Attending First Christian has exposed me to religious traditions in and beyond Christianity in ways that celebrate the many faces of faith.

As Peter Jennings said after years of living in the Middle East, "there is no one absolutely essential truth for all people, and... every time I look at a coin, I instinctively want to look at the other side."








Unity Worship Service on July 30th!
