WHAT'S IN A NAME?
PASTORAL REFLECTION

Throughout the month of June, I have been traveling to several different camps. The first week I was invited to counsel at Camp Kum Ba Ya in western Kentucky from my former pastor growing up, Rev. Jamie Eubanks. After that week, I was invited to counsel the Explorers camp at Camp Bedford and High School/Middle School camp at Geneva Center, both in Indiana.

Every week, we looked at the same curriculum and asked this question every day: "What's in a name?" I, along with the campers and fellow counselors, took time each day to reflect upon the power of names and how our names can define us, define our relationships with one another, and how names can create meaning in our faith journeys with God. We reflected upon the biblical stories of God calling Moses from the burning bush; Jesus calling Zacchaeus out of the tree; Elizabeth naming her son John; Naomi naming herself Mara; Jacob being renamed Israel; and Jesus naming Simon Peter. This curriculum quickly became a personal favorite of mine and I believe a relevant one for not just our youth but many people who wrestle with the questions of "Who am I?" "Who is God?" and "What is the meaning of the names that define us?"

In addition to myself, this year,

we had 10 church youth attend camp this summer and reflect upon the same questions and learn the same biblical stories that I did:

Ross Brown attended You & Me Camp at Geneva Center with his grandmother Leanah Brown.

Nora Carlson, Anna and Addie Lindsay attended New Beginnings Camp at Geneva Center.

Harley Rangel attended Explorers Camp at Geneva Center.

Hailey Lobaugh and Malachi Meyers attended Explorers Camp at Camp Bedford.

Jacob Rangel attended High School camp at Geneva Center.

Justice Strietelmeier and Ashlyn Adams attended Middle School camp at Camp Bedford.

Seven of these youth had never attended church camp before.

Eight of them received full scholarships to attend camp this summer because of the generous donations the church provided earlier in the year.

I can not be more thankful for your support of our children to attend camp this summer! Your generosity and care for our youth gave them the opportunity to learn and grow in their faith and walk away this summer remembering that God knows their names and calls them all beloved children of God.

Interested in Baptism?


Pastors Darla and Kevin are planning to host another Baptism class for the fall. If you and/or your child is interested, please reach out to them as we will be working on setting a class date for August.

NEW ADULT ED OFFERING: FCC BOOK CLUB!

When and how often? Beginning on Sept. 6, and continuing on the first Tuesday of each month from 6-7:30

What's it about? The focus will be on books that can lead to spiritual, personal, or community growth, mostly nonfiction but not all. They will also hopefully inspire interesting conversations. This book club is a time of fellowship and community growth. The books are accessible and most are reasonably short.

How do I sign up? You don't have to sign up, just show up. While we'd love to have you every month, you're not obligated to come every time. In fact, if you're only interested in one or two books, you may choose to come to just those meetings.

Who chose the books? Kelly Stanley, as adult education coordinator, compiled a list after talking to several leaders and members of the community. The group will choose books for two of the months, and the topics are subject to change based on the interests of the group. But in order to allow people plenty of time to get the reading done, we're giving you a fairly complete list up front.

What will be expected of me? All you need to do is show up (and preferably be part of the discussion, if you're so inclined). However, if a particular book or topic really speaks to you, you may volunteer to lead or facilitate that discussion. We will have the book's authors present for at least two of the meetings.

Where can I find the books? The church library has one copy of each of the books that you may borrow and pass around. Most are also available at our library. Also, the church office will have copies of Mark Frank's book (for September) available during office hours for \$10 apiece. In addition, that book can be purchased at Quest for Balance or on Amazon. Watch for a display to come in the Narthex so you can take a peek at these titles.

HAITI NEEDS YOUR HELP!

As you may remember, FCC member Ryan Venis founded a charity called Avek Anpil Men Medical Relief (AAMMR) in 2014. The charity helps fund a medical clinic just outside Port-au-Prince, Haiti, ran by Haitian doctors and dear friends Vlaidmyr & Merline Roseau and Francise Milien Dorestyl. Recently, Drs. Vlad and Merline have taken their mobile clinic to a civilian women's prison and the needs are tremendous. Here are words from Dr. Merline on July 7th...

Today I want to share with you a really great and difficult project we have. It's about a mobile clinic we are invited to do in the civilian women prison, the biggest one in the country. We went last Thursday for a visit and we had found out those needs that we wanted to share with you: They have around 230 people from 17 yo to 70 yo, including a baby and 50 officers and other staff members. They have a nursery but not functioning—no drinkable water, no electricity, no water in shower inside. Praise the Lord they have a well outside but decreasing the security, food available only one meal a day, clothing are wearing out. Ok, why I am telling you all that? I am sure it's a lot, but as you can see, today is a year of commemorative of our president's murder. With no more details the situation is chaotic, the complaints we had from the leaders of the prison made us scared because we are just a small clinic trying to help and because of the Covid we missed our friends who would like to help us in many ways. We know we won't be able to cover all their needs but we wish to do as much as we can in medical and sanitation. We will take someone to spray the entire local area because bugs of all kind are giving troubles. We are taking someone to help clean hair and do nails. We will try to get some used clothes to take also. We will look for some big rechargeable flash lights for the guardians officers, put together some hygiene kits, will be bringing some bread, powdered milk, peanut butter and crackers. That is the best we think can do. If by chance you can share with your friends or church for some support, we will be grateful. Take care. We don't have a date yet as we still putting stuff together.

Unfortunately, getting supplies to Haiti is challenging at best. But if you would like to help Drs. Vlad, Merline, and Francise and their Alpha Omega Medical Ministries, you can always donate monetarily to AAMMR. The money is then mailed or hand-delivered to Dr. Vlad every few months while he is here in the States. **Here's how you can donate...**
