A REFLECTION FROM JUSTIN MEYERS

While some people's journeys have included painful church experiences, I am thankful to look back at all the ways the local church has been there for me.

I was born in Indianapolis in August 1980. My family attended Heather Hills Baptist church on the east side from when I was a newborn to fifth grade. I accepted Jesus Christ as my Lord and savior on July 24, 1989 when I was eight years old (though we had not yet met, the date is also Tammy's 5th birthday). It was after a youth group meeting when I went to my mom and told her I believed and wanted to accept Christ.

As an infant I was denied baptism by the Catholic church. Though my grandparents wished for me to be baptized, the priest refused because my parents did not attend mass there. My grandparents had enough and left the Catholic church then. When I was old enough to understand and decide for myself, I was baptized at Gray Road Baptist Church on June 12, 1994. I appreciate how the Christian Church extends the welcome for all to be baptized and take communion.

I have many great memories growing up in church and feeling loved, welcome, and the sense of community they provided. Starting in 1992 at age 12, my family and I were part of a new church plant called Friendship Baptist church in Greenwood. We helped set up the church in a community center each sunday morning for a couple years



until we built a building. Many great memories and friendships were established which continue to this day. I had a great childhood and a loving family. My large family of six struggled financially for many years though and relied on a patchwork of government assistance, free school lunches, WIC, and food stamps to make ends meet. I recall several times when the local christian church dropped off food and presents at Christmas.

When I was 13 my appendix ruptured and I was hospitalized for 7 days extremely ill with an infection. My life was saved by the incredible doctors and nurses at St. Francis hospital. It was several months before I fully healed and regained my strength. My family did not have health insurance at the time, and several anonymous donors from church generously stepped up and helped my parents cover the substantial medical bills. Going without,

living paycheck to paycheck, and food insecurity were frequently part of my life growing up. This experience is why I feel drawn to serve in programs like FISH, Meals on Wheels, and Foodfinders. It's great that the church places such a strong emphasis on supporting these programs and serving our neighbors with love, compassion, generosity and dignity.

I met my best friend and partner Tammy in 2000 at Friendship Baptist Church in Greenwood, and we were married there in 2002. We welcomed Harrison in 2003. In June 2009, our second son Sullivan was stillborn. Our church family was there for us with their presence, meals, and prayers as we tried to begin to grieve this profound loss. In May 2010 we welcomed Malachi.

We moved from Indianapolis to Crawfordsville in 2010 after I took a position at Purdue University. We knew little about the community other than it being a nice stop and pleasant community on our previous trips to Turkey Run and Shades. With our families in Indianapolis and work in West Lafavette. Crawfordsville was a logical middle point. It's been a wonderful place to live and have our kids grow up. We found a great Christian church in Waynetown and attended there for several years. After the pastor left, it became clear it was time for us to move on too. Being a part of a church and faith community was important to us but

we could no longer agree with many of the teachings about science and about the LGBTQ+ community. It left us longing and searching for something more in line with our values. We were seeking a church home more inclusive, where the free offer of salvation was extended to all, seeking unity and healing, not divisions.

We have been attending FCC since December 2021 and members here since December 2022. We got to see Malachi baptized here in March. We are so thankful to have found this loving and welcoming faith community at FCC and look forward to learning, growing, and serving with you all in the years ahead.

So, Praise Wednesdays will focus on music that was written this century – music being played on Christian radio and streaming channels -- music being enjoyed by Milleniels and Generations X, Y and Z.

We will not meet this week because of Vacation Bible School. But Praise Wednesdays will resume next Wednesday, July 26.


I am looking forward to singing with you.
