
# Education for Ministry—starting this fall

From Helen Hudson at St. John's Episcopal Church:

Our spiritual lives as Christians are quirky, complex things. Sometimes it's as simple and clear as children singing, "Jesus loves me this I know/For the Bible tells me so." Other times it's a thicket of doubt—or a shock of wonder and awe. Sometimes the mind just gets curious and wonders how the faith has endured and changed across the last 2000 years (and more).

Yes, I'm writing to see if YOU might like to be part of EfM (Education for Ministry) starting this fall. I know you will have heard about the big reading assignments but that's not the heart of EfM. The central idea is for you as an individual to take a bit of time to ruminate and reflect on your personal theological journey. The books we read serve as our guides and prompts for discussion and rumination. There are no tests or quizzes! EfM is a national (even international) program run out of our Episcopal seminary at the University of the South. Last year there were 1600 groups operating in churches and communities across the nation.





# **NEW ADULT ED OFFERING: FCC BOOK CLUB!**

When and how often? Beginning on Sept. 6, and continuing on the first Tuesday of each month from 6-7:30

What's it about? The focus will be on books that can lead to spiritual, personal, or community growth, mostly nonfiction but not all. They will also hopefully inspire interesting conversations. This book club is a time of fellowship and community growth. The books are accessible and most are reasonably short.

How do I sign up? You don't have to sign up, just show up. While we'd love to have you every month, you're not obligated to come every time. In fact, if you're only interested in one or two books, you may choose to come to just those meetings.

Who chose the books? Kelly Stanley, as adult education coordinator, compiled a list after talking to several leaders and members of the community. The group will choose books for two of the months, and the topics are subject to change based on the interests of the group. But in order to allow people plenty of time to get the reading done, we're giving you a fairly complete list up front.

What will be expected of me? All you need to do is show up (and preferably be part of the discussion, if you're so inclined). However, if a particular book or topic really speaks to you, you may volunteer to lead or facilitate that discussion. We will have the book's authors present for at least two of the meetings.

Where can I find the books? The church library has one copy of each of the books that you may borrow and pass around. Most are also available at our library. Also, the church office will have copies of Mark Frank's book (for September) available during office hours for \$10 apiece. In addition, that book can be purchased at Ouest for Balance or on Amazon. Watch for a display to come in the Narthex so you can take a peek at these titles.
