Sometimes it just stuns you


Like an arrow flung from some angel's wing.



#### FCC AWARDED A RESOURCE GRANT!

On August 17, 2022, First Christian Church was notified that it was approved to receive a **\$4,000 Resource Grant** from the Indianapolis Center for Congregations!

The grant funds will be used to contract with LIT Consulting to perform an **energy audit** for our church building and to provide recommendations from their findings.

First Christian's interest in reducing our energy consumption moved from a general conversation, in response to examining our financials at a monthly board meeting, to a call to action when we joined Thriving Faith Communities and were able to see what other congregations were doing with energy savings. This company has a track record of helping churches realize significant savings in energy usage and cost. TFC is church focused so clearly understand both the opportunities available and how to navigate the issues raised by congregations during this process.



This grant funded energy audit will help FCC pinpoint both the physical areas where energy can be conserved as well as in how we program and use our space for ministry.
