





Putting Food on the Table

It is so good to see how this congregation rises to the occasion. I'm referring to a notice in late August that the FISH Food Pantry was critically low on food and their next delivery was still a week away. Many of you didn't receive word of this until Saturday evening, Aug. 26th. But your food offering on Sunday morning was tremendous, and your generosity has continued these first two Sundays in September.

For the calendar year 2023, from January 1st through August 20th, our Sunday morning food donations averaged 43.5 pounds per week. But look at this:

Aug. 27 138 lbs

Sept. 3 117 lbs

Sept. 10 83 lbs

That last Saturday night in August, you must have emptied your cupboards at home, because the notice went out so late there wouldn't have been time to go shopping.

FISH is closed on Mondays, so I deliver our food offerings on Tuesdays, my day to volunteer there. When I went in on August 29th, I was shocked at how bare our shelves were. But food from several other churches and organizations was coming in, and by opening time at 3:00 we were able to handle the crowd. There are always limits on quantities, and we had to be a bit more limiting than usual that week, but we had food for everyone. Nonetheless, by the end of the day the shelves were looking pretty sparse again.

I want you to know that just about everything I deliver on Tuesdays goes home with a client that same day. Every family wants pasta and sauce; you can make it go a long way. Every family wants peanut butter and cereal and a mix of vegetables and fruits. Everyone needs toothpaste, brushes, and soap. The items you bring each week are in genuine demand, and they go straight home to become a family meal.

It's in the book. "I was hungry, and you gave me food."

We're doing a good thing here. Thanks for making it happen. ~*Don Lindsay*
