Wabash students and singles of all ages. We agreed we need to grow in sharing our communal story, and the hope we've experienced, with others who may be looking for a refuge or a spiritual home. It was shared that there are people that just don't know we're here and inviting someone to church is statistically the number one reason people visit a new church.

We'd like to continue to be creative and bold in our great efforts in outreach as well take time to grow in our relationships through fellowship opportunities like hiking or hosting an intergenerational picnic at a state park, planning annual intergenerational outreach and immersion trips here in the U.S. and perhaps even abroad. Continue to include storytelling and sharing in small circle groups, in home groups, and in worship. Create more inclusive opportunities for all to

participate in Sunday lunch gatherings and dinners for 8. Hosting monthly movie or documentary nights, have a booth at the Farmers Market or an intergenerational stargazing night.

In addition to offering more education opportunities,


there was also lots of discussion about worship. Some of the hopes voiced centered around a worship that offers a variety of genres of music, along with the hymns, and a variety of instruments (but not a drum set). Intergenerational Choir, bells and chimes were also of high interest to all.

First Christian Men's Pool Fellowship



No, that's not my old school locker combination. Not an address on our street. But it's a pretty big number. 2,182 is the number on the scales for all the food we've donated to the FISH Food Pantry in 2023. I've been ready to broadcast the news when we hit one ton for the year. We reached a ton, and went well beyond it last Sunday. And you may want to know that we gave 2,109 cans, jars, boxes, tubes, and brushes to reach that ton.

When I went into the Sanctuary Sunday morning, there were already cans and jars in all four of the baskets our children use to collect food. I put all the stuff into one basket to free up the other three for the kids.

I'd had a call from a member who would not be in church on Sunday to say she'd left cans in the little fourdrawer receptacle by the door to the parking lot. Sure enough.

When I saw what our youngsters were receiving from the congregation, I was wowed. After church I filled up two heavy boxes and one full basket and headed for the car. When I got there, there were bags of groceries already stacked in the back.

I mentioned recently that the average weight of our weekly food contributions for this year had been 45 lbs. Then we had the "empty shelves" crisis at FISH, and your response on Aug. 27 was 138 lbs.

Since then, our weights are	9/03	117,

and this past Sunday,	9/24	188 pounds.

You folks are just terrific. Thank you for your faithfulness to this ministry to food-insecure families. I spend my Tuesday afternoons at FISH, and I meet a lot of parents who are so relieved, so grateful, that they won't have to worry about feeding their kids for a couple of weeks.

There are children in our world and in our county who can't count on eating a meal before going to bed. I was hungry and you gave me food. That's where we come in. Thanks for being here.

New Regional Minister Called!

The Regional Board of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in Indiana has called **Rev. Dr. Christal L. Williams** to serve as the next Regional Minister. The historic decision was made with a unanimous vote of the Board during a called meeting on September 2, 2023. Rev. Dr. Williams will begin her ministry here in January 2024.

Rev. Dr. Williams currently serves as the Regional Minister and President of the Christian Church in Tennessee, a position she has held since 2016. Prior to her ministry in Tennessee, she served 17 years as Associate Regional Minister in the Illinois/Wisconsin Region. She understands

congregational dynamics and employs a style of leadership that many people describe as "grace-filled and truth-telling." She possesses a bold faith in Jesus Christ and a deep love for God's people.

Born in Cleveland, OH, Christal is a graduate of Jarvis Christian University (Hawkins, TX) and Christian Theological Seminary (Indianapolis, IN). She received her Doctor of Ministry from United Theological Seminary in Dayton, OH. She is a former Trustee of Christian Theological Seminary and currently serves on the Board of Directors for the Christian Church Foundation and the Executive Committee for International Disciples Women's Ministries. She was ordained in 1998 at Southport Christian Church in Indianapolis, IN.

At its meeting, the Regional Board also called Rev. Carolyn Reed to serve as Acting Regional Minister through the end of 2023. Carolyn has faithfully served as Associate Regional Minister in Indiana for the past 24 years. She will continue to provide care and leadership to congregations and clergy in the Region during this time of transition.


