"Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."

As I am writing this letter, I am preparing myself for my Bethany Fellows ministerial retreat that I am currently attending this week. I am truly thankful for the opportunity to step away and find some time for rest and renewal.

However, I openly admit that I struggle taking time for rest. Instead of taking time off, I will take time to check my emails or respond to phone calls or work on a pressing project that I am working on. I'm the type of person who will metaphorically drive their car with less than half of gas in their tank until I am borderline empty. It's a habit I have continued for most of my life including throughout college, seminary, and during my time working at the hospital. However, working at the hospital with less than half a tank

of gas helped me to see that is not healthy and can impact my life, my health, and my ministry.

In preparation for my time away this week, I was reading a devotional and came across the Matthew 11:28-30 text, where lesus is inviting people to find rest within him and God. I find this scripture to be a source of comfort, knowing that we can find rest in God's beloved son. And I find this scripture to also be an invitation and a challenge. After all, Jesus was preparing his disciples to continue his work on earth after he left and we, the present day disciples of Christ, are continuing this great movement that Jesus had started. The work of the church can be very busy and may take a lot of time from our lives.

But despite all the long important work that we are called to do as the Church, Jesus in this passage reminds us to find time for rest so we can re-fuel our metaphorical gas tanks and take care of our bodies, minds, and spirits.

Again, I thank you for allowing me the opportunity to step away and re-charge my energies so I can continue my work in serving this church community.

I pray that if you are in need of rest, that you remember that Jesus invites you to make time to replenish your souls and may we find rest and renewal in the God who loves us unconditionally.

Church Budget Update

As we approach our annual stewardship campaign in October, we can celebrate some facts:

- August giving: \$11,821.00
- Through August, our currentyear expenses (excluding onetime costs) are about 2%, or \$4600, below budget
- We project tithes and offerings will be slightly above budget.
- However, with a considerable shortfall built into our budget, we're still projecting a deficit for the year, and the Governing Board continues to work on ways to close this gap.

As we begin to prepare the 2022 budget, let's keep in mind what a budget does for the Church.

- It helps us keep track of income and expenses, of course, but it is much more than that.
- It is aspirational, reflecting what is most important to us as a congregation.
- It also assigns each and every dollar we give to FCC a specific job, whether paying our wonderful staff, maintaining our marvelous building, supporting local and global ministries, or providing for our church programs.

Christian symbol of the Fish. Early Christians would use the Fish symbol to identify one another in the community. For me, the Fish, along with this stole, reminds me of Jesus feeding the multitudes in the gospels. As lesus fed the people, I too am called to feed and serve the hungry in the world and this stole represents my calling as a minister. I am thankful to **Community Christian Church** for this wonderful gift and that I get to share this stole, along with my gifts and calling, with you and the world!
