ATHE PATHFIND

I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect.

ROMANS 12:1-2

Have you ever been in a circular huddle of athletes right before an athletic meet or game? Many times, in these pre-game huddles athletes will place their palms upon each other like the spokes of a wheel coming together at the center. 

Stole Stories Corner

Stoles are worn by clergy as a symbol of their ordination and their office of ministry, as well as a visual representation of when Jesus wiped the Disciples' feet during the last supper (representing that we, too, are servants of the church). Each of Rev. Darla and Kevin's stoles has a story, which we will be sharing over the next few weeks.

Darla's "Children" Stole

On the occasion of my ordination to Christian ministry in November of 2007 at Webster Groves Christian Church, in St. Louis, Missouri, I received this stole as a gift from a colleague who was serving there. Later, my mother, Rev. Darlene Goodrich, graciously gave me a small version of the same stole, which she wore throughout her ministry.

The woven pattern of the stoles displays people of different races, ethnicities, age, gender, attire, and culture. This represents the diverse body of Christ across our world of which we are all a part and the diversity of humanity God created. When wearing

this stole, it reminds me that God's inclusive love is meant for all human beings. The children on the stole are also a reminder that Jesus especially welcomes children as precious members of God's kingdom. For this reason, I love to wear this stole during children's moments and when celebrating the diversity of God's children in worship, such as on World Communion Sunday, or any Sunday!

I am grateful to Webster Groves Christian Church for their support and care throughout my journey towards ordination and also for my mother's love which I feel every time I place this stole upon my shoulders.
