THE GIFT OF NOT BEING PERFECT A Pastoral Message

Several months ago, when I visited my sister and baby nephew Noah, I was introduced

to a show that has now become a personal favorite of mine: Bluey. After only watching a few episodes with my nephew, I returned home and have watched every episode at home. The animated show features a family with a mother, father, and two children (ages 6 and 4) living their lives. There are many episodes which offer a life lesson for both children and adults and the one episode I wish to share here in this message is called "Bike." In this episode, one of the children (named Bluey) is trying to learn how to ride a bike but fails each time. She gives up in frustration but after a talk with her dad (and watching her friends and sister struggle to accomplish their own goals on the playground), she is encouraged to try again and eventually succeeds in riding her bike! When I watch this episode, I am reminded of the disciples Jesus called at the beginning of each gospel. Most of them were fishermen and had no religious training before meeting Jesus. Normally Rabbis would call

individuals who studied their scriptures and were already planning to follow in the footsteps of the religious leaders of their time; but Jesus does not do this. Instead, he calls individuals who were going to make mistakes and fail at times. To me, this is a gift... to know that Jesus doesn't call the "perfect" to be his followers but instead calls us instead to try to do the best we can in spreading his love into the world. Every time I make a mistake, I am grateful for this reminder that Jesus calls me to be who I am and to simply keep trying; for no matter what, I and all of us, will always be loved by God and Christ. May this message speak to you where you are in your spiritual journeys and many blessings to you all.

PLEDGE SUNDAY THIS WEEK!



- Shoes for hiking (if desired) or games to share with others: corn hole, horseshoes, frisbees, soccer ball, etc.






Get your new Church Directory!




