### "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path."

**PSALM 119:105** 

Every year, Advent occurs in December, a period in which the days continuously get shorter until the winter solstice, the shortest day of the year. Metaphorically, we can imagine the growing darkness of the day is a representation of the shadows that we see all around us in the world. These shadows can manifest in different ways, including but are not limited to: Despair, Conflict, War, Violence, Sorrow, Depression, Hatred, and Apathy.

Advent is known as the season of waiting and preparing for the birth of Jesus Christ into the world. Advent is also a journey we all take together. On this journey, we remember 'Immanuel'- that God is with us every step of the journey to Christ birth. In John Pavlovitz's Advent devotional, Low, he states, "as we walk the road of Advent, the invitation is not to escape this place to an elevated heavenly sanctuary somewhere..." We are invited to remember God's word and love that will reveal light onto our paths. The journey of Advent teaches us how to not give in to despair, conflict, sorrow, and hatred, but to shine the lanterns of light that Christ brings forth through his birth:

Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love.

As you enter the sanctuary each Sunday during this season, you will see lanterns representing our Advent journey together. Each Sunday, a new light will shine,

dispelling away the darkness and revealing the word of God that Christ invites us to embody. May God's light give us strength, wisdom, and comfort during this season as we wait and prepare to celebrate Christ's marvelous birth.




### **FCC BOOK CLUB**




### We want YOUR ideas!

### UPDATE ON THE RAHIMI FAMILY

Dear Crawfordsville ARC,

As we enter the holiday season it is time (past time) for an update on our Afghan family. ARC has been working with Exodus Refugee International for two full years and with our adopted family for almost 22 months. Wow. So much has happened. So many steps forward, and a few back. So many challenges overcome, and others yet to come. But the most important thing to know is that ARC has made a huge difference in the R's lives.

Mr. R has been driving buses for IndyGo for seven months, after completing his training with them in mid-March. He is under contract with the bus company for two years. This quarter he works the second shift Saturday through Wednesday, with Thursday and Friday off. In early December Mrs. R will celebrate one year as an infant childcare provider with a faith-based daycare center in Brownsburg. She loves her work, her coworkers, and the little ones she cares for. Her spoken English is progressing well. Daughter Sana is a bright, happy, and very enthusiastic kindergartner in the Brownsburg school system. Masoud, Mr. R's brother, has worked for several months at a commercial bakery, after having worked for Goodwill for over a year. He speaks English well, seems to be a dependable, hard worker, and has friends. The entire family moved into a new apartment in downtown Brownsburg in late August.

But there have been setbacks, too. When Mr. R's mother died at age 62 at home in Kabul mid-October he missed a week's work for which he was denied bereavement pay because he could not provide an official death certificate. He missed another week in November when he contracted salmonella, and another week earlier while a bus

accident he was involved in was investigated. Mrs. R has had several health issues that resulted in emergency room visits, diagnostic testing, and several days of lost work. ARC contributed \$500 to help pay their December rent. otherwise, only once since April have they needed help paying their normal monthly expenses. (WAPC maintains a restricted fund for Afghan Refugee Relief into which contributions to ARC and to support the R family have been deposited. The money now remaining in the fund is committed to help pay for Mrs. R's root canal and crown when the work can be arranged.)

Working and spending time with the Rs as they faced such events has made us more and more aware of the challenges confronting not only newly arrived refugees to our country, but also all those living on the economic margins in America. The Rs have been blessed to have the support of ARC and they are grateful beyond words for it. But there are so many more families who live on the knife's edge of job, housing, food, and health insecurity. It takes perseverance, courage, ingenuity, sacrifice, faith, and help from others for them just to survive.

We all are inundated with opportunities to serve and give during the holiday season. If you, members of your congregation, or your church would like to contribute toward meeting some of these occasional emergency needs of our Afghan friends, including Mrs Rs impending dental work, you can write a check to Wabash Avenue Presbyterian Church, indicating "for Afghan refugees" in the memo line, and send it to 307 S. Washington, C'ville, 47933.




A photo of the Rs during their Thanksgiving Day visit. They are a lovely, happy family.
