There are many reasons why Advent is a special time each year. The purpose of Advent is to wait for the coming of Jesus' Christ birth, which happens after four Sundays, concluding on



Stole Stories Corner

Stoles are worn by clergy as a symbol of their ordination and their office of ministry, as well as a visual representation of when Jesus wiped the Disciples' feet during the last supper (representing that we, too, are servants of the church). Each of Rev. Darla and Kevin's stoles has a story, which we will be sharing over the next few weeks.

Kevin's "Jesus" Stole

When I came here at First Christian Church last year, Darla shared with me several stoles as gifts. One of these stole is what I like to call the Jesus stole. It's a unique stole because it's irreversible with different colors. The colors often represent the different liturgical seasons in the church year. For example, green

often represents the "Ordinary Time" that occurs right after Pentecost and lasts all the way until Advent. Purple is commonly seen during the Advent season as purple is often associated with the royalty of Christ. While the symbols are each side look different, they are both called a Christogram, which is a monogram or combination of letters that forms an abbreviation for the name of Jesus Christ. The letters are all in the Greek language and are the first three letters of Jesus in Greek: lota-Eta-Sigma. The purple side also places a Cross to remind individuals of Christ's sacrifice. These Christograms are often seen in Catholic churches, but many protestant traditions also adopt these symbols in our liturgy and practice as well. Whenever I wear this stole, I remember all that Jesus gave to us and the world.
