



Offerings and Donation Statements



What So Many Want for Christmas: Food on the Table

We here at FCC have experienced a remarkable increase in our giving to the FISH Food Pantry over these past four months. I mentioned in a previous article that our weekly contributions to FISH were averaging 45 lbs per week. That was the case from our first weekly food offering on October 2, 2022, through August 20, 2023. Weekly totals during that time ranged from 26 lbs to 211 lbs, and averaged 45 lbs per week.

Then we turned a corner on August 27. Our food offering that Sunday was 138 lbs. We'd seen bigger offerings like that from time to time, but this time there was no drop-off back to the 45 lb *average*. Our smallest offering from August 27th to last Sunday, December 17th, was 76 lbs. Our weekly average over that time has been 111 lbs. **Our contributions have more than doubled**. I'm very glad that they have, but I'm not sure why.

Apart from one urgent call in late August for more food to restock empty shelves, we haven't been pestering you for more and more food. But you're bringing more and more food, without the pestering. Thank you, Jesus! Thank you, FCC! As of December 17, our total contributions to FISH for 2023 come to 3,377 items equaling 3,577 lbs. I'll update these numbers at year's end.

By the time you receive this Pathfinder, most FISH clients will have made their last visit for food before Christmas. So that you will know, everyone who came during this week (Dec.12-15) received these holiday items: bag of frozen strawberries, breakfast sausage, pop-open cans of biscuits and cinnamon rolls, full box of margarine, milk, eggs, and hot chocolate, plus all the other usual necessities. These same or similar offerings should be available to clients during the week just before Christmas.Thank you so much for your faithful concern for those of our neighbors in Montgomery County who struggle with food insecurity.

Volunteers for Mental Health in Montgomery County is offering a free training opportunity for the adult version of Mental Health First Aid. Details are provided below:

COURSE CONTENT: "Mental Health First-Aid (MHFA) introduces participants to identify common signs and symptoms of mental health and substance use-related challenges, builds understanding on their impact and provides an overview of common supports. This eight-hour course (including the 2 hours pre-work) utilizes activities to demonstrate how to offer initial help in a mental health crisis and connect persons to the appropriate professional, peer, social and self-help care.

MHFA takes the fear and hesitation out of starting conversations about mental health and substance use problems by improving understanding and providing an action plan that teaches people to safely and responsibly identify and address a potential mental illness or substance use disorder.

DATE: Friday, January 19

TIMES: registration, coffee/tea, and breakfast items beginning at 8:30 a.m.

Instruction will begin at 9:00 a.m. and end at approximately 3:30 p.m. If the group chooses to work through lunch, it is possible to conclude earlier.


