

PASTORAL MESSAGE

Advent is a season of the year that often reminds me of that part of the life of faith that has us living in between both memory and hope. We stand with gratitude in what is already given by God even while living into what is promised in Christ. This is the very heart of where new birth or transformation finds it home in our lives - somewhere in between what theologians refer to as the "already and not yet."

I think of this season as that important reminder of the "in-

betweenness" of every day where Emmanuel (God with us) is always birthing new possibility in our lives **now** even if we may not recognize the unfolding of it until later.

Sometimes hope requires looking back to remember how God has been at work in us, even in some of the most difficult moments of our lives, before hope it is able to look forward. Jesus birth in the world long ago gives us this kind of hope!

Advent is a particular time that invites us to be attentive to this

reality—as we sing the great Christmas hymns of the season and hear the ancient story which invites us to be watchful for God's presence with us now—to dare to live on the bridge between sunrise and sunrise—the place of the unknown where faith finds its legs, where God's abiding mystery lovingly awaits our eyes to see and ears to hear both the memory and hope birthed through Jesus Christ our Lord! Thanks be to God!

Welcome, Paul Johnson!

On behalf of the FCC Board & Personnel we are pleased and excited to announce that Paul Johnson has officially agreed to serve as our new Freelance Music (& Choir) Director. He will begin his first week at FCC beginning January 3 with plans for the choir to sing its first anthem with him on Sunday, January 9.

Composer/Conductor A. Paul **Johnson** has for decades been an active independent artist and crossover Producer marking musical innovations for the late 20th & 21st Century in both concert and sacred repertoire. Paul's work as a church musician started by playing services at his High School, Brebeuf Prep. (a Jesuit School) along with accompanying the choirs, soloists, and theatre productions there. He toured for many years with regional theatre and eventually landed in Florida as a Composerin-Residence with the Pinellas County Arts Council (St. Pete/ Clearwater area). He organized his own production company in Florida which provided performing arts services for a diverse group of schools,

community centers, performing arts ensembles, and often as many as six churches where the corporate pool of various talents would create concert series, special community programs like youth theatre, pageants for special seasons like Christmas and Easter, and in most cases weekly service music too for a number of denominations.

Paul is a native Hoosier, and in 2014 re-settled back in Indianapolis where he provided music for two years at First Christian Church in Mooresville, and then spent five years as organist for Northwood Christian Church, both Disciples of Christ congregations. His large repertoire of recordings and compositions are published by Performers Edition in Indianapolis. The premiering and commissioning ensembles for his original music have included local groups like the Carmel Symphony, Indianapolis Philharmonic, Indiana Repertory Theatre, and Louisville Mandolin Orchestra alongside international venues such as

the Prague Symphony Orchestra, Ensamble Rosario (Argentina), Warsaw National Philharmonic, and the Slovak Radio Orchestra.

As a teacher Paul has maintained studio clients in vocal coaching, which he considers his pedagogic specialty, and has taught seminars, master classes and as an adjunct professor for Vincennes University, Bellermine Univ., Central Florida Community College, Canterbury Preparatory Episcopal School, and Pacific College of Costa Rica.

Dr. Johnson has been awarded fellowships from the National Endowment for the Arts, the National Institute for Music Theatre at the Kennedy Center, two Individual artist Fellowships from the Florida Arts Council and two Pulitzer Prize nominations for concert music composition. He worked for 20 years as Producing Director for the Apollo Project, Inc. creating stage shows, concerts, artist residencies, CDs, a television pilot, broadcasts and educational programs. He studied composition with Thomas Briccetti in Indianapolis and with Carlisle Floyd at the University of Houston. His Doctorate is in Philosophy from Pacific College of Costa Rica.

We celebrate the long legacy of music excellence at FCC as we continue to bask in this final week of Richard's outstanding leadership, which brings so much light and joy especially through the music in the Christmas Cantata and Christmas Eve services. It is a bittersweet time as we move through this transition in music ministry, even as we give thanks to God for how God continues to bless this congregation with tremendously faithful and gifted people!

Members continue to call on members who are shut-in, or call by phone, or mail a card, showing God's care even when we can't be together. It's been a strange, difficult year and yet—and yet—as we face the new year I am excited and feel blessed to find that we anticipate ending the 2021 budget year with only a very small deficit, and that we have increased our pledged giving and resources this year to continue the work of this church, this loving community, even in uncertain times.

Your pledges to First Christian Church will allow us to again create a budget which supports our staff as they bring us together in worship and for other programs, to maintain this building where we can meet both to worship and learn, but also provide youth activities and child care, and to provide outreach to our community and to support the mission of the Disciples of Christ in our Region and around the world. **This 2022 budget contains an increase in your individual giving and also a bequest of \$20,000 from the family of Karen Apple and an anonymous gift of \$10,000 to enhance the Parlor.** For each of you I give thanks.

On January 2nd, we will meet as a congregation to approve the budget for 2022. At this same meeting we will consider several revisions to the Constitution of the church. 
GEORGE & KAREN VENIS JOIN FCC
