I have an interesting relationship with the stories found in the beginning of Exodus. Before the age of 12, I did not grow up going to church and my family never talked about religion or God, at least nothing I could remember. And yet somehow, I was very familiar with the character of Moses and how he


freed his people from the Pharoh in Egypt and brought them to the promised land. The reason for my familiarity with this story is because of the 1998 Dreamworks' animated film, "The Prince of Egypt. To this day, the Prince of Egypt is in my top ten favorite animated movies. The animation is phenomenal, the storytelling (while not fully accurate to the writings in Exodus) is incredible, and the music beyond amazing! Every song in the movie is performed with such passion that it draws the viewer into the movie even more. If you were to ask me which one is my favorite, I would say "Through Heaven's Eyes" performed in the movie by Brian Stokes Mitchell.

In the film, this song is sung by the character, Jethro, to Moses after Moses has fled to the land of Midian. Moses feels he is not worthy of receiving hospitality from Jethro's family and tribe because of what he has done in his past. The song beautifully asks Moses (and the listener) to not measure our worth through our limited human understanding but instead through the eyes of Heaven (or more specifically, God).

"So how can you see what your life is worth Or where your value lies? You can never see through the eyes of man You must look at your life Look at your life through heaven's eyes" For me, I feel humbled imagining how God's love for me, for everyone around me, and for the entire world is far greater than I could ever truly understand. Whenever I have moments of doubt about what I may 'can or cannot' do, these lyrics remind me that God's love is seeking to remind us all of the wonderful worth that we each have and the positive works we are capable of when we remember to believe in ourselves because God loves and believes in us.

So, I invite you to wonder with me: What would it mean for us to measure our lives not through our eyes, but through God's eyes? And how is God's love inspiring us and transforming us each and every day?




